

Ms. Alliester Xavier Stokes

September 28, 1956 - July 14, 2020

Alliester Xavier Stokes (aka Zaya) was the fourth born child of Shirley E. Lawson Stokes & Charles A. Stokes on September, 28, 1956 in Baltimore, Maryland. Both of Zaya's parents preceded her in death. Zaya was named after her deceased maternal grandmother Allester Chase Lawson with the spelling variation of the letter (i) added to Zaya's name. Zaya preferred to be called by her middle name "Xavier" thus family and friends shortened it & called her "Zaya".

Zaya grew up in the Cherry Hill Community of Baltimore City. She was very talented in the performing arts of acting and dancing. In Elementary School, Zaya was selected as the star in the play "Alice in Wonderland." During her middle/junior high and high school years Zaya was active in the Cherry Hill Recreation Center's programs and excelled in modern dance. Zaya was a good academic student and was accepted into the rigorous college preparatory program into the historical Western High School! Zaya was also accepted into the Neighborhood Youth Corp(NYC) during high school. The NYC program provided her a work study apprenticeship working in the Cherry Hill St. Veronica's Church's Headstart Daycare Center. Zaya worked well with the pre-school children and staff at the Daycare Center and was affectionately called "Miss Cookie." Upon graduation from Western High School in 1974, Zaya enrolled into the Community College of Baltimore City and took Early Childhood Educational Courses while still employed at the St. Veronica Headstart Daycare Program.

Zaya was a zealous supporter of her many nieces and nephews. She even took them to work with her while working at the St. Veronica Headstart Daycare Center and attended their activities (i.e. birthday parties, graduation and special extracurricular activities). During family gatherings, whenever there was music playing and a dance floor Zaya out danced the best of the dancers and would dance during the entire event just like the 'energetic, indomitable' nonstop bunny!

Zaya moved to Philadelphia during the past 15 years with a lifelong friend, Lynne Graham and Lynne's mother, Ms. Mildred Graham, but maintained contact with her many siblings, nieces and nephews. Zaya was a kind nurturing person and helped provide care to Ms. Mildred Graham as Ms. Graham's health deteriorated. Zaya worked at the election polls and would do errands for her neighbors like shoveling snow, going to the store and even

driving them to various appointments. While living in Philly, Zaya suffered a stroke to her left side (she was left-handed) which damaged her speech and debilitated her mobility. However, she would still attend family gatherings of birthday parties, weddings, anniversaries and still "cut the rug" and out danced everyone!

Zaya was preceded in death by maternal grandparents, Harvey and Allester Lawson (aka, Big Mama), paternal grandparents, Jesse and Dorothy Savage (aka Mama Dot), paternal brother, Dwight Johnson and two nephews, Michael D. Stokes (aka Mike Mike) and Kevin R. Burnett, Jr. (aka Little Kevin). She leaves to mourn her death 10 maternal siblings: (8 sisters and 2 brothers); Jacqueline (Jackie) Moulton Davis (husband Thomas/Tano); Donnita (Donnie) Stokes White; Sharon D. Stokes; Kevin L. Stokes, Sr. (wife Dorothy); Craig S. Stokes, Sr. (wife Ericka); Carla Stokes Burnett (husband Kevin, Sr.); Rene' (Nanet) Stokes Whyte (husband Cleveland); Siterria P. Stokes (Terria); Tanya Stokes Wheeler and Alicia (Lisa) L. Stokes. Zaya also leaves to mourn her death 8 paternal siblings (6 sisters and 2 brothers): Charles (Ricky) Stokes (wife Kathy); Eris (Reissa) Robinson; Kim Stokes; Terrell (Terry) Stokes; Sharlene Stokes; Lorae (Ray) Stokes; and Tanyae Stokes Estep (husband Darryl); a host of nieces, nephews, grand nieces, grand nephews; 1 maternal uncle (Jerome A. Lawson); a host of cousins; a lifelong special friend, Lynn Graham; and a host of friends. Alliester Xavier Stokes' high energy, fun-filled spirit will be missed by her siblings, many family members and friends.
