



## Mr. James Edward Friday, Sr.

June 19, 1963 - September 13, 2019

Elder James Edward Friday, Sr., was born in East Orange, New Jersey on June 19, 1963 to Embry A. Friday, Jr. and Sallie Mae Friday.

He was educated by the East Orange public school system. He attended East Orange High School where he served on the Principal's Advisory Board and Library Council for four years. He was a member of the legendary East Orange High School Panthers Marching 100 band and concert band. He later attended Morris County College in New Jersey.

Elder Friday accepted the Lord Jesus into his heart as his personal savior at the age of 9 and began immediately working in the ministry under the leadership of the late Apostle Arturo Skinner, founder of Deliverance Evangelistic Center of Newark, New Jersey. At the age of 10 Apostle Skinner began to groom him for leadership. He graduated from the Deliverance Bible Institute under the same ministry in 1986 and became a licensed Evangelist. After Apostle Skinners' passing, Elder Friday remained with the ministry under the leadership of Apostle Ralph Nichols.

In 1997 Elder Friday met and became friends with B. Jamal Broadnax of Greater Destiny World Ministries. Out of this ministry and friendship the Greater Destiny Fellowship of Churches was born. Through this ministry Elder Friday became the Overseer. In 2015, he became "Bishop Designate" and entered training to be consecrated as a Bishop in the Ministry.

Elder Friday was employed in the field of security for many years before obtaining a commercial truck driver's license in 2005. He then became an "over the road and regional" driver which he continued until 2016.

Elder Friday later met Terri Jackson and they were married in 2012. He and his loving wife, Terri would have celebrated seven wonderful years of marriage this November 3rd . The two of them began fellowshiping with Redeeming Love Outreach Center in 2016 and eventually joined the ministry there in October 2017. Elder Friday had a passion for working in ministry and always worked diligently wherever he was needed. He was excited and anxious to begin serving in the ministry at RLOC but illness prevented him from becoming active.

Elder Friday is preceded in death by his parents Embry and Sallie Friday. He leaves to cherish his memory his wife Terri, his children Jasmine Lockett-Epps, James (JEF) Jr., and twins Jared & Jeremy Friday, his stepchildren Marci, Shaun and Alicia Jackson, and two grandsons, Dominick and Isaiah. He also leaves his Brother Raymond, God-Sister Karen McMillian, God-Brother Raymond Price and a host of aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, cousins and friends to remember his life.
