

My mother told me to tell you it was Uncle Cap that made them work on the farm..... Not your grandmother. Cap was born around 1912 and would be about 110 years old today. He died a long time ago. I wish you could ask him WHY?



Everyone here thinks that Vincent should have been with Sarah (his beloved mother) and his siblings. Even the ones that you are lashing out at. She, also, said Granny wanted to keep me like she kept Vincent. I call her Granny because she raised my mother. My mother STOOD HER GROUND and took me with her. Anything else you have to take that up with those individuals. There are times in life where people are NOT always truthfully and they coverup truth to protect a lie. As a result, other people become collateral damage because of the lie. Other people were allowed to speak their mind and get things off their chest. And so did I. Vincent is no longer here so that chapter is now closed. People cannot go back and rewrite history to make themselves feel better. It doesn't work that. So sorry. Live your life and be happy. I'm done with this. I have nothing else for you.
